UPDATING YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION



Has your name, OHIP number or contact information recently changed?

- You can now update your personal information on our <u>website</u>.
- It is important that we have up-to-date information on your medical record so we can deliver seamless and timely care.

COVID-19 VACCINES

The TWFHT continues to offer both Pfizer and Moderna vaccines for both dose 1 and dose 2 at the Bathurst location. Click here to book your appointment.

- Everyone born in 2009 or earlier is eligible for vaccination.
- Both Pfizer and Moderna mRNA vaccines have been given to millions of people worldwide. They are safe and highly effective at preventing serious complications of COVID, hospitalization and death, including protection against the Delta variant. We would not recommend these vaccines to our valued patients if we did not 100% believe in their safety and effectiveness.

Third Dose

A 3rd dose of the COVID-19 vaccine is now approved in Ontario for certain groups. Information on eligibility can be found here.

- The TW FHT will continue to strive to offer COVID-19 vaccines to all of our eligible patients on site.

MEDICAL EXEMPTIONS TO VACCINATION

We are receiving increasing numbers of requests for medical exemptions to the COVID-19 vaccine. **IMPORTANT: There are very few approved medical exemptions to COVID-19 vaccination.**

Medical exemptions will only be considered for the following:

- 1. Severe allergic reaction or anaphylaxis to a previous vaccine
 - The allergy must have been documented and evaluated by an allergist/immunologist, and the allergist/immunologist must have determined that you are not able to receive a COVID-19 vaccine.
- 2. Documented and cardiologist confirmed history of **myocarditis or pericarditis** following the first dose of an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine.

- 3. Serious adverse event following a previous COVID-19 vaccination, requiring hospitalization, or resulting in a persistent or significant disability/incapacity.
 - This event must have been medically evaluated and documented. The treating specialist must have determined and documented that you are unable to receive any COVID-19 vaccine.
- 4. Actively receiving monoclonal antibody therapy OR convalescent plasma therapy for the treatment or prevention of COVID-19.

MEDICAL EXEMPTIONS TO MASKING

The TWHFHT will not be providing any mask exemptions. No medically valid reasons not to wear a mask have been determined.

If you do not meet the above criteria, we will not book appointments to discuss medical exemptions.

We are following the criteria established by our governing body, the <u>College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario</u>, and are not able to make any exceptions outside of the criteria listed above.

VACCINE PASSPORTS

Vaccine passports come into effect in Ontario on September 22, 2021. You can review the details of this policy here.



How can I obtain my vaccine passport?

- You can download your proof of vaccination on the <u>provincial website</u> if you have a green photo OHIP card.
- If you do not have a photo OHIP card or do not have access to the internet, call the provincial booking line at 1-833-943-3900.
- The government plans to release an enhanced version of the vaccine passport by October 22nd, 2021.

What if I was vaccinated out of province?

If you received a COVID-19 dose outside of the province, you must submit your proof of vaccination through the <u>Toronto Public Health Portal</u>. We cannot update your vaccination profile on your behalf.

Copies of vaccine receipts

Unfortunately, we are not able to provide patients with copies of their vaccination records-please follow the steps above to obtain an electronic receipt.

COVID-19 SCREENING QUESTIONS

Did you know you can save time by completing your COVID-19 screening questions on a UHN app prior to your medical appointment?



You can complete the screening questions **up to 2 hours before** your appointment.

For your safety and the safety of others, you will be placed in a separate room if you fail screening.

SEPTEMBER 30TH, 2021-TRUTH & RECONCILIATION DAY

The Government of Canada dedicated this day to honour, reflect, and commemorate the approximate 150,000 children who were victims of the First Nation Residential School System. The discovery of over 1,100 unmarked children's graves over the course of this summer has undoubtedly left our community and country in shock.

Dedicating this day is one of the 96 recommendations of the Truth & Reconciliation Commission of Canada. This day is meant to recognize the significant impact that these schools have had on First Nation families and their culture.
